#### IMPROVING ECD OUTCOMES

Knowing how critical Early Childhood Development (ECD) is for young children (aged 2-5) in preparing them to succeed in school, we partnered with **ideas42** to use behavioural science as a new way to think about improving ECD outcomes. Together we completed phase 1 of the ideas42 methodology, defining the behavioural problem, by conducting a series of interviews with ECD practitioners and caregivers with the help of the organisation **Inceba Trust**.

## COVID-19 VACCINATION CONFIDENCE, ACCESS AND ROLL-OUT

This report collated the work shared and discussed by members of the International COVID-19 Behavioural Insights and Policy Group (BI practitioners and policymakers in more than 20 governments, international organisations and contributing academics) to support global vaccination efforts. We worked with the UN Innovation Network to organise the case studies and lessons learned into three main themes: how to create the intention to vaccinate, translate that intention to action and finally, how to encourage appropriate post-vaccine behaviour.





#### **VPI @ SCHOOLS**

Over a 10-week period which began in September 2021, we collaborated with J-PAL Africa and WCED to test the Violence Prevention Initiative (VPI) @ Schools programme - a CBT-inspired curriculum that promotes **emotional** self-regulation and future orientation. We prepared and trained 16 facilitators, to work with over 150 learners in 4 schools in the City of Cape Town.

### BI LESSONS FROM THE GLOBAL SOUTH

This is BI4GOV's latest blog series! We spoke with BI leaders across the globe about their work in the Global South and the lessons they have learned. So far we've looked at setting a new 'gold' standard with **Dilip Soman** and keys to success when applying BI in unpredictable contexts with **Faisal Naru**.

#### **VIRTUAL ENGAGEMENTS & NEW PARTNERSHIPS**

From Behavioural Economics in Action (BEAR), the United Nations Office of Counter-Terrorism (UNOCT), to BX Arabia, Nigerian Economic Summit Group (NESG), the WHO and more, BI4GOV participated in a wide range of webinars and online events to present some of the work we've done in the WCG. While we miss in-person encounters, the virtual world has facilitated exchanges and extended our connection to an enriching community. This year, we established two new exciting partnerships with **J-PAL-Africa** and



**BIOrg** (Behaviourally Informed Organizations). These are both unique opportunities to meet mutually beneficial goals as we apply BI to complex behavioural challenges and explore and leverage behavioural insights to find solutions and make positive change.

## DECISION-BIAS TRAINING AND BI CLINICS

Dr Umar Taj, an Associate Professor at the Warwick Business School, joined us in Cape Town in early April to run a two-day **Decision-Bias workshop** which exposed WCG senior management participants to the fundamental errors in judgement and assisted them to develop strategies to correct these. Whilst visiting, Umar ran a **BI Masterclass** and shared his expertise in BI Clinics where we brainstormed with the Department of Community Safety and Cultural Affairs and Sport to identify a behavioural issue and a potential solution to improve project outcomes.
